Safety Officer's Report - Roger Dahl

I'd just like to once again pass on something that I recently did that pertains



to safety. A couple of weeks ago, I had forgotten to turn off my transmitter after flying a plane, and it ran the NiCad batteries down. Upon finding my mistake, I recharged

the batteries, thinking that everything was fine. What I did not realize was apparently when the battery loses this much charge, the settings for a particular plane may, or may not be affected.

A couple days later, I took one of my small electric planes out to a park just on the outskirts of town to fly. I checked the elevator. I checked the rudder. I checked the throttle, and then I wiggled the ailerons to check them. All looked great, so I took off only to immediately realize that my ailerons were reacting backwards! I tried to fly using only rudder, but I knew it was going to be a matter of time before I did something really bad, so I managed to crash in an open area to avoid any dangers. The plane is destroyed, but I learned from it something that I would like to pass on to others.

When we check the controls on our planes, it is important that we not only verify they are "hooked up, and move", but that they are correct! I have thought of a simple reminder for ailerons that I will use from now on. "Roll Right, Left Lowered", which means if I put the stick to the right, I will look for the left aileron to be lowered. Simply wagging them back and forth, as I have learned, can be dangerous!
